#### **SECMA - Scottish Episcopal Church Missionary Association**



A very long time ago (perhaps in the 19th century) the SEC were given the missionary responsibility to raise money and awareness for two parts of the Anglican Communion - Kafraria, Eastern Cape, South Africa, and Chandra, West Bengal, India.

I grew up with this knowledge and in my teens Dr Guy Danes, came to speak of the work in Kafraria. In the 1950s/60s, the SEC employed the Rev'd Leslie Drage to go and see, and come back and tell us of the wider

church. One year in the early 1960s the Diocesan Youth Conference invited him as their speaker. It was a pivotal experience for me, in my involvement and interest in the work of the Anglican Communion.

In 1995 when I returned to Scotland, I became interested in SECMA, the present day SEC missionary charity. It is a very small charity working with small projects that aren't covered by the big charities. This year they are supporting work in South Africa, eSwatini, Kenya, South Sudan, Palestine, Myanmar, Botswana, Latvia, Ethiopia, Lebanon. This year contributions from the Dioceses raised £5632, of which our Diocese raised £290, the Diocese of Brechin raised £1465!
